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Pursuant to Sec. 2-140F of the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2, Administration, as may be amended, the following is a list of properties or sites in South Portland that have been recognized by City Council Order as archaeological and historic resources that contain special significance in the history of the City, the State of Maine, and/or the United States of America. The Inventory is filed and maintained by the City Clerk. The City Council may amend the Inventory by Council Order, and any amended Inventory shall be filed with the City Clerk. Section 2-140F(b)(1) designates the criteria that establish eligibility for listing on the Inventory. To be listed, a building, structure, site, or object to be added to the Inventory, one or more of the following criteria shall be met, as determined by the City Council after positive recommendation for inclusion from the HPC:

- (A) It is a structure, building or site at which events have occurred that contribute to and are identified with, significantly represent, or exemplify the broad cultural, political, economic, or social history of South Portland, the region, the State of Maine, or the nation, including sites of buildings at which visitors may gain insight into larger patterns in the heritage of the area.
- (B) Structures, buildings, or sites associated with important historic persons, including those sites which represent the work of a master builder, master designer, architect, or landscape architect.
- (C) Structures, structural remains, or sites which embody examples of architectural types or specimens valuable for the study of a certain period, style, or method of building construction.
- (D) Sites embodying examples of community organization and living.
